Executive Summary

In the following you will read how our team, “SLCC Squad,” came together to strategize and implement solutions to the problem of messy housemates: “What would be the best approach to address a messy housemate?”

Using Dewey’s Reflective Thinking Sequence in our online chats, we came up with solutions for the problem. The stakeholders include those affected by the problem as well as others who may come and visit the house. The history of the problem was previously discussed, but we decided to discuss other methods to improve the rules, addressing each housemate’s concerns towards the problem.

The goal of the criteria was to identify the problem of living with a messy housemate that would benefit all household members and not offend one another. We created a criteria chart to determine a solution to best fit everybody’s interests. As a group we came up with six different solutions that meet the guidelines of the criteria chart, and then chose the best three solutions to create an ultimate solution for everyone.

The final solution is to assign someone to deep clean the house each month. Swapping schedules is allowed if needed. Other solutions include cleaning-up after one’s self, with a pre-assigned monthly calendar and organization of the home when needed. There is also a \$20 fee after the fifth violation each month for not following the rules.
